Our Foodstore ministry continues, providing help to Women's Aid, asylum Seekers and local people in our community. Since January 2022, we have distributed over 370 food hampers with the very generous support of our fellow churches at St John's Newtownbreda, Ballynafeigh Methodist and Good Shepherd/Holy Rosary.

We have expanded our food mission to assist a church plant in North Belfast and hope to bring a little festive cheer to all our customers with our Christmas Food Hampers, helped very generously by our own 'Little Cookes'.

Demand has grown considerably in the last year and we expect this to continue. Thank you to everyone who has contributed to this work in the last year.

### A SEASON OF THANKSGIVING

Over Advent I'm looking forward to celebrating together. We are journeying towards Christmas with a series called great expectations....great expectations of fun and community, but also great expectations of God at work in us and through us. Despite the narrative of crises and darkness there is so much to be thankful for as Immanuel comes among us and remains with us.

I wish you all a very blessed Christmas and can't wait to continue in the Cooke adventures ahead together in 2023.
