Demand for Foodstore assistance continues to rise. We are grateful for the continued generosity of our congregation and those of our partner churches Good Shepherd, St John's Newtownbreda and Ballynafeigh Methodist. Our own Little Cookes provided wonderful food baskets at Christmas to boost our stocks and we are very grateful to Ormeau Credit Union for their monetary donation, which has enabled us to continue to provide fresh food items with our food packs. EDMUND ARUOFOR



An answer to prayer.

Two days after attending Cooke on Sunday 10th October 2021 to tell us about his work in the LifeHub NI food parcel charity, Edmund was taken into hospital with Covid 19. He spent 35 days on a ventilator in an induced coma in intensive care. His health took a further turn for the worst in November and he had to be resuscitated.

In an article in the Belfast Telegraph, he says that he was scared of dying but not of death. He was more scared that he was being taken too soon before he could fulfil what God had put him on earth to do. We know that many in Cooke were praying for his recovery and we were delighted that he came back to Cooke in January to let us know that he was well on the way back to full health. We thank God for answered prayer.

THE CAMPBELL'S WORK IN MALAWI

A collection was taken at the Christmas Carol by Candlelight service to support the ongoing work of Jim & Ruth Campbell in Malawi. We were overwhelmed by your generous support and money continued to be received into the start of January 2022. The following letter, thanking you for your generosity has been received from Jim & Ruth.



Ruth and I would like to thank you for your generous donation at Christmas to our fund for helping needy people in northern Malawi. The various groups we help are related to the work we were involved in when we went back to work in Malawi for a period after we retired from Cooke.

As you probably know Ruth worked in the hospital at Ekwendeni, mostly in the Children's Ward and with the Palliative Care in the Community programme. Sadly, there are many mothers who



are HIV Positive and who sometimes die in childbirth or shortly afterwards. Their babies are then generally cared for by relatives. However, they can only survive if they receive formula milk for the first 6 months of life. Most poor rural people are unable to pay for this as it is very expensive, We try to supply this until the babies are weaned on to high protein porridge which is manufactured at Ekwendeni Hospital and is much less expensive and which we also purchase for them.

We also pay the school fees for some older orphans who are selected for secondary school – there is no free schooling for post-primary children and many just drop out of school at this stage.

Ruth has long been involved with palliate care nursing here in Ireland and when we were at Ekwendeni she would go out with local staff into the rural villages to help terminally ill patients living in very poor conditions in simple peasant homes. We continue to help fund this service.

Then most years there are usually one or two emergencies caused by extremes of weather or due to some child needing special hospital treatment and there nothing is free so try to help out in such situations.

We know and have worked with the local people with whom we cooperate in these projects and have confidence that our support reaches the people who really need it.

Thank you for your generosity that enables this work to continue.

This semester consists of twelve weeks ending 8th April, each week I will have 2 days in Union, on Tuesday during morning worship I may be asked to read or participate with a prayer and in the afternoon we will study Christian Ethics.

On Thursday my prayer group meet together in Union. I have a few day courses to attend as well in Union.

Three days each week, or six sessions, I will be working in Whiteabbey Presbyterian Church. The deaconess Rachel Cubitt is a blessing and lovely to work with. I am very blessed Whiteabbey are safely opening various activities, I am very busy in the Church.

On Sunday, I sometimes participate with a reading, I will be encouraged to help more with Sunday morning worship in the near future. At the moment there is no evening service for me to attend.

Thank you so much for all your prayers. I do miss all my Cooke family.

PROF PATTON TAYLOR IN NIGERIA

We were pleased to have helped the Little Cookes raise £350 to give to Patton to support families in Nigeria to pay for medical care. Tommy Heasley presented Patton with the money on Sunday 12th December prior to his trip in January.

Prayer Letter - 2200 hrs on Monday 24th January 2022

After a Covid-imposed gap of almost two and a half years, I am once again on board a BA flight waiting to take off for Abuja. After several postponements in the date, the pre-flight online Covid and immigration requirements almost defeated me again this morning - but finally I have made it! I would like to thank you very much for continuing support over these last few years which has helped to make this current trip possible. Over the two years I have been keeping closely in touch with the two Theological Colleges where I act as visiting Professor; and have developed a significant online mentoring role not only with college staff but also with students, former students, and other young people with leadership potential for the future of the Nigerian Church. Many of these young people and their families have suffered increased hardship owing to the rapid inflation and the exponential increase in prices caused by the effects of Covid on the economy – and I have greatly appreciated those who have helped me to give significant financial help to many in need (not least with basic medical costs for children).

This trip is planned to last almost seven weeks. The first week will largely be spent in the city of Jos, isolating in the home of one of the full-time missionaries until receiving the (hopefully negative) result of the compulsory post-arrival PCR test.

Then there will be two weeks of intensive teaching in each of the two United Evangelical Church (UEC) Colleges in which I have been privileged to be a regular visitor across the last seven years or so. This involves not just lectures and seminars, and participation in College community outreach activities, but also a lot of time given to mentoring individual members of staff and students.

Then, after a few days in the southern city of Uyo (where the Church HQ is based), it is back to Jos for supervision sessions with doctoral and PG students in one of the bigger Colleges there, together with visiting a number of folk who have become close friends over the years. That will bring me to the beginning of March – with a return date scheduled for March 8th.

I ask for your prayers for the strength and stamina (at age 70) for an intensive teaching programme, for the heat (often over 35 degrees), and for several arduous journeys; for wisdom and insight both in the classroom and in one-to-one conversations; for immunity from covid, malaria, and other health hazards; and for safety not just from unrest or terrorism but (most of all) from danger on the roads!

I'll write again in a couple of weeks and let you know what I have been up to. Once again, many thanks for your ongoing support and encouragement, which I greatly appreciate in what I believe to be a worthwhile project. I hope you and yours are all "staying safe". God bless for whatever 2022 may bring.


